Whether it's a bedtime story or a quiet moment after school, these **shared experiences** offer lifelong benefits. Reading together stimulates **imagination**, encourages **curiosity**, and introduces children to different **experiences**.



All classes have participated in the *Premier's Reading Challenge* again this year. During the Reading Challenge, students were encouraged to explore and enjoy a wide variety of books. Across the school, students read an impressive *17 575 books - 1 119 more* than last year! Congratulations to all students who returned their reading logs. Certificates are on their way, and we are excited to announce that *Year 4* is the lucky winner of the *Pizza Party*, which they'll be celebrating tomorrow.



This *Thursday*, our *Year 1* classes will visit the riverbank to investigate how spaces and places have changed over time. They'll also explore the animals found in this area and learn their Darumbal names. These experiences connect with their English and HaSS units this term.

Yesterday, the **Year 5** classes held their **Space Science Expo**, showcasing what they've learned throughout the term. It was fantastic to see so many parents attend, and the visiting classes thoroughly enjoyed seeing the displays.
